SHOW OVERVIEW

This 2-day Horse Driving Trial is sanctioned by the Alberta Equestrian Federation (AEF) as a Wild Rose Competition. Each day will be

treated as a separate show and will include all 3 phases of competition: Dressage, Cones and Marathon. The event will be run under the 2019 American Driving Society (ADS) rules unless otherwise stated. ALL competitors must provide proof of membership with their Provincial Sports Association (Alberta Equestrian Federation or provincial equivalent).

Entries are limited and accepted on a first paid basis (must be post-marked on/before August 9, 2019). Late entries may be accepted, if space permits, and may be subject to a \$25 late fee. Entry fees are only refundable at the discretion of the organizing committee.

ACDA Member: \$150 weekend or \$100 day
Non-Member: \$175 weekend or \$125 day

As a sanctioned "Wild Rose Competition" all eligible entries received prior to the entry deadline will be entered into the AEF's "Win Your Entry" program which awards one competitor (selected by random draw) with a refund of their entry fee (to a maximum of \$150).

LOGISTICS

The Klondike Carriage Classic Show will be held at the Brown's farm at 58218 Range Road 260 Vimy, AB

Camping: Dry Camping is available on site (no hook-ups) at no cost. Outdoor bathrooms are available (no showers). Hotel and motel accommodations are available in Westlock. Self-stabling via panels or electric fence will be permitted in a designated area at no cost.

Dogs: WELL-BEHAVED and QUIET dogs are welcome provided they are under the direct control of the owner, either leashed, caged or confined to your trailer. Unattended loose dogs are a safety risk and will not be tolerated.

Food: A concession may be available on-site Saturday & Sunday for breakfast and lunch. Arrangements can be made with the caterer for supper or you can look after yourself for suppers.

Entertainment: The Klondike Chapter will host campfires on Friday and Saturday evenings.



DIVISIONS

TRAINING LEVEL: Open to novice drivers and drivers with horses that have not competed at higher levels. This level is recommended for competitors beginning Combined Driving competition or for seasoned competitors driving inexperienced horses. Marathon obstacles will not be timed.

PRELIMINARY LEVEL: This level is suitable for beginning competitors with some prior competition experience, such as training level, driving trials, mini-CDEs, etc. Marathon obstacles will be timed.

INTERMEDIATE LEVEL: This level is for competitors who have successfully completed at least 3 Combined Driving events at Preliminary Level or higher.

CLASSES

Horse: any equine over 148 cm without shoes or 149 cm with shoes

Pony: any equine 120 cm to 148 cm without shoes or 149 cm with shoes

Small Pony: any equine 99 cm to less than 120 cm with or without shoes

Very Small Equine (VSE): any equine under 99 cm with or without shoes

PRIZES

Ribbons will be awarded daily for 1st, 2nd & 3rd places in each Division. Prizes will also be awarded for Best Junior, Best Dressage, Best Cones and Best Marathon Time (Preliminary and Intermediate), as well as High Point awards for the top aggregate score over both days in each Division.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

- ◆ This Competition will be run under American Driving Society (ADS) Rules unless otherwise stated below. For a complete listing of rules and regulations governing this competition, please download the 2019 ADS Rulebook at www.americandrivingsociety.org
- ◆ The Alberta Carriage Driving Association, Klondike Chapter, the officials, volunteers and all landowners on whose property the competition will take place, and any affiliates will not be held responsible for any theft, accident damage, injury, illness or death of horse, owners, driver, grooms, ground personnel, spectators or any person on the properties whatsoever.
- ◆ **The landowners and the Klondike chapter require that all competitors, grooms and other persons riding upon a carriage shall sign the landowner's waiver document and wear protective headgear.**
- ◆ The Alberta Carriage Driving Association (ACDA) Safety Rules will be in effect. These are available on the ACDA website at albertadriving-acda.ca and will be posted at the show office.
- ◆ A certified First Aid Attendant will be available onsite during the competition. Local paramedic and veterinary personnel will be available on an on-call basis (contact information will be posted).
- ◆ The Organizing Committee has the right to limit entries, combine classes or refuse any entry. Some competitors may have participated in organizing this event and/or course construction.
- ◆ Any equine 4 years old or over is eligible to compete.
- ◆ Well-behaved, experienced driving stallions will be permitted at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.
- ◆ Carts/Carriages: Any safe vehicle is acceptable. Reflectors and slow-moving vehicle signs are not required unless driving on a public road. Pneumatic tires are acceptable in Training Level only, as long as they are on a solid, sturdy wheel (bicycle-type wheels with thin metal spokes are not permitted due to safety issues). Solid smooth rubber wheels are **required** for all levels other than Training. A spares kit **must** be included on the carriage at all times and may be checked by the Safety Officer.
- ◆ JUNIORS: Junior Competitors are 18 years of age & under. Junior Competitors under 14 years of age must be accompanied in the carriage at all times by a groom who is an experienced, adult horse-person. Junior Grooms must be at least 12 years of age in Training & Preliminary, minimum 14 years of age for Intermediate Level and must be capable of rendering assistance to the driver. **At all times while on a carriage, Junior Competitors and Grooms must wear a body/back protector and a securely fastened Protective Headgear.** (see ADS Article 928.3).
- ◆ All competitors (with the exception of Single VSEs and Small Ponies <120cm) must be accompanied by a groom/navigator during the marathon competition. All multiple hitches (pairs, 4in hands, etc.) must be accompanied by a groom(s) in all competitions (see ADS Rules Article 937.3/943.2.16 for groom requirements). Please arrange to have a groom/navigator prior to the show and alert the show office secretary if scheduling issues may arise (e.g. drivers grooming for another driver or a groom attending multiple drivers). Drivers/grooms may act as groom/navigators for other competitors if the schedule allows (please note desire to do so on entry form).
- ◆ **ASTM/SEI approved Protective Headgear and a body/back protector MUST be worn by all persons on a vehicle during the Marathon competition.**
- ◆ It is strongly recommended that all competitors and grooms wear a Medical Armband containing a list of personal medical conditions and requirements. This information is for use by medical personnel in case of an accident.
- ◆ Any questions or complaints should be directed to the Technical Delegate. Questions/concerns will be addressed in consultation with the organizing committee.

DRESSAGE

Tests

TRAINING (singles & pairs): ADS Training Test #1

PRELIMINARY (singles & pairs): ADS Preliminary Test #1

PRELIMINARY (tandems and fours): ADS Preliminary Test #5

INTERMEDIATE (singles, pairs, tandem, team): ADS Intermediate Test #1

Dressage tests can be obtained from www.americandrivingsociety.org. Please note: Training level drivers are not permitted to have their tests dictated to them (as per ADS Rulebook Article 945.2).

Presentation will be judged “on the move” and will reflect cleanliness, style of dress and appearance. Jackets or national dress, driving aprons, hats/properly secured and gloves are obligatory for Competitors. For Lady drivers, a jacket is optional. Grooms must wear jackets or national dress, hats and gloves. Approved protective headgear is recommended. A whip in hand is required.

The Dressage Arena sizes will be as follows:

CONES/OBSTACLES

Cones will be run as a Fault Competition. Length of the course will be a maximum of 800m. Dress code will be as for Dressage. Speeds and clearances will be in accordance with the 2019 ADS Rule Book. There is a bridge planned on this year’s course for Preliminary and Intermediate Divisions.

MARATHON (Section B only)

Marathon Length: The total marathon distance will be up to 10 km with up to 6 obstacles.

Dress Code: Any style accepted, gloves recommended. Drivers are required to carry a whip in hand at all times while on the marathon course. **Competitors and Grooms must wear securely fastened Protective Headgear and Protective Vests during the Marathon.**

There may be a water obstacle with a dry route option for training, as well as a wooden bridge, also with an option to bypass this. Use of breeching is mandatory for singles and those vehicles that have no brakes.

Training Level will complete 3 gates (A, B & C), and are permitted to walk/trot anywhere on course. Obstacles will be timed but times will not be posted. Training level competitors are NOT permitted to canter on the course or within the obstacles.

Preliminary Level will complete 4 gates (A, B, C & D), and Intermediate Level will complete 5 gates (A, B, C, D & E) within each obstacle. Obstacles will be timed with times posted.

Preliminary and Intermediate competitors can travel at any pace while on course or in an obstacle but must walk or trot the last 300 meters of the course, or after the last obstacle if less than 300 meters from finish.



SHOW OFFICE TIMES

The Show Office opens Friday evening from 5:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Competitors & Grooms must report to the show office upon arrival to pick up their Competitor's Package and to sign the required waivers.
